Processing of personal data In order to effectively manage the licenses of our application software and provide optimal support, a user account is created on our server with every license request (or updated if an account already exists). The account contains the user's name, email address and employer. We assign this account the information when and with which IP address the user last logged into the account.

The data are accessible to the employees of our electrical development department.

The legal basis for this processing is the legitimate interest described above (Art.6 section 1 letter f GDPR).

Deletion of data The user can log in at <https://lum.seavis.org/> using his login data and manually delete the user account in the "Settings" section.

We delete the user account automatically if the user has not logged in (manually or by using a software) for 12 months.

Rights of the data subject You have the right to information about the data stored by us and to receive it from us in a common, machine-readable format. You may request that the data be corrected and object to the processing of your data for reasons arising from your particular circumstances. You have the right for your data to be deleted or for its processing to be restricted respectively.
